# A Message from Rich....

### THE GOD OF OUR IMAGINATION

What do we imagine God to be? Is God a man, a woman, an unseen impersonal force driving the universe and the cosmos? Is the God of your imagination big, strong, tough, or intelligent? Is your God happy, sad, angry, vengeful or loving and forgiving?

Here is the question for all of us adults: Now that we are adults, and presumably thinking for ourselves, how do we honestly imagine God to be? Do some of us have an image of God that we received from our parents, teachers, priests, religious leaders and others? Are we holding to a fear of God that may have been the result of something we were told as a young child? Are we believing in a God that keeps score of good and bad and has an up to date checklist prepared to judge us with? Is your image of God that of a punisher, a supreme being who is a harsh judge and wants to send us to an eternal banishment?

In a study of His Son Jesus we begin to see a different face of God, one that is an expression of love and understanding, rather than that of a distant punishing God. Instead of an angry God, one who sits in a distant kingdom far away in the clouds, I prefer to experience the God who told his disciples to bring the little children to him so they can sit on his lap to laugh and play. I see a loving God who said He came to earth so show us what we needed to do in order to live with Him forever. I see Him as an approachable God, who wants us to come to Him with all of our fears and phobias, faults and misunderstandings.

We must take God seriously of course, for He is Lord of all. He is Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier, all knowing, all powerful and present everywhere. I am convinced that He does not want us to be afraid of Him, to be fearful of Him. Rather, I believe He wants us to have an abundance of respect and awe as we approach Him. He seeks us out to have a close intimate relationship with Him, for we are His children and He is our loving God. We can imagine having a meal with God, laughing, eating and enjoying our time with Him. We can imagine Him saying how much He enjoys His time with us, his children.

Why not take some time and reflect upon your own image of God and how being an adult you relate to Him. Cast away those negative concepts you may have learned as a child and see Him as the loving Father He really is. Let me suggest that we all take the time to be still and relate to Him in a loving way, as a child does to a loving father






## **Simply Giving:**
