Sharing the love of God

A message from Interim Pastor Ryan Kobert

Dear friends in Christ,

Please read this vital notice from our synod secretary, Rev. William Schaefer:

"At the August 2025 Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, amendments were made to the ELCA constitution. Those amendments resulted in amendments to the Model Constitution for Synods and the Model Constitution for Congregations.

The Model Constitution for Congregations, like the other governing documents of this church, reflects the theology and polity of this church as it organizes itself to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ, share the sacraments, reach out to the neighbor with good news, and share the love of God in the world. Each expression of this church — churchwide, synod, and congregation — is held together in a relationship of interdependence that encourages each to respond to its context. These documents also demonstrate our commitment to seeing ourselves with others as part of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. As such, the Model Constitution for Congregations is deeply rooted in Scripture, the Lutheran Confessions, and the history of this church and its predecessors.

Pursuant to *C16.04. of the Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, both required and non-required amendments made to the Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America may be voted and adopted by a single vote at the next meeting of your congregation, provided the congregation is given 30 days notice of the revisions prior to the meeting. If your congregation has not recently reviewed or updated its constitution, this would be a good time to do so."

Pastor Kobert's NOTES

There are some required changes that will need to be made to the constitution for congregations so that they are in line with the governing documents of the churchwide constitution. This means that our own congregational constitution will need to be amended at one of our annual meetings.

There are fifteen provisions that were amended in the model constitution, with two being optional and thirteen being required changes. The changes made were mostly for clarity sake, either by reformatting a provision adjusting a cross-reference to be within the congregation constitution rather than reference the synod constitution - or to keep language consistent with other provisions.

For the two provisions that do not fall under this umbrella of changes for clarity sake, one is an optional change and the other is simply changing the provision from optional to required. The change in C10.02 is optional, and it allows congregations to call a special congregation meeting at the request of a percentage of the voting members. Currently it calls for a specific number of voting members.

The provision that is changing from an optional one to a required one is C9.15. This provision allows for "a minister of Word and Sacrament of a church body with which the ELCA officially has established a relationship of full communion [to] serve temporarily as pastor of [the congregation] under a contract between [the congregation] and pastor."

With pastors of other denominations serving as interim pastors in Lutheran congregations, and vice versa, this amendment was changed to increase the ability of bishops and congregations to have interim pastors during a time of calling a pastor.

LESSER FESTIVALS & commemorations

November 1 All Saints Day

The custom of commemorating all of the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the third century. All Saints Day celebrates the baptized people of God, living and dead, who make up the body of Christ. On this day or the following Sunday, many congregations will remember the faithful who have died during the past year.

November 3 *Martín de Porres, renewer of society, d.1639* Martín was the son of a Spanish knight and a freed black slave from Panama. As a lay brother in the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), he engaged in many charitable works in Lima, Peru. He founded an orphanage, a hospital, and a clinic for cats and dogs.

November 7 John Christian Frederick Heyer, d.1873 Bartholomaeus Ziegenbalg, d.1719 Ludwig Nommensen, d.1918 missionaries

Heyer was the first missionary sent out by American Lutherans. After teaching at Gettysburg College and Seminary he was assigned to the Andhra region of India. A worker among the Tamil people on the southeast coast of India, Ziegenbalg was opposed both by local Hindus and by Danish authorities. He was known for caring about the welfare of the whole person. Nommensen was born in northern Germany and was sent to Sumatra as a Lutheran missionary. Working among the Batak people, he translated the scriptures into their language and honored their native culture.

November 11 *Martin, Bishop of Tours, d.397* Martin's pagan father enlisted him in the Roman army. Approached by a beggar, Martin cut his cloak in half and gave part to the man, whom he later understood as representing Christ. He asked to leave the army, but was jailed instead. After his release, he became a preacher, and later a bishop.

November 11 *Søren Aabye Kierkegaard, teacher, d.1855* Kierkegaard was a Danish theologian whose writings also gave rise to the modern philosophy of existentialism. He frequently attacked the complacency of the state church of his day, as well as its desire to be accepted by polite society rather than be a stumbling block.

November 17 *Elizabeth of Hungary, renewer of society, d.1231*

Born in Hungary, Elizabeth was betrothed to the son of the Landgrave of Thuringia, and at age four was taken to be raised with him at the Wartburg Castle. Ten years later they were married. She was very generous to the poor, and after her husband's death she lived in cruel hardship until her own death at age twenty-four. November 23 Clement, Bishop of Rome, d.ca.100 Clement was the third bishop of Rome. He is best remembered for a letter he wrote to the congregation in Corinth, still struggling with the same problems that led to Paul's letters to them. As did Paul, he focused on the need for love among Christians.

November 23 Miguel Agustín Pro, martyr, d.1927 Pro grew up among oppression in Mexico, where revolutionaries accused the church of siding with the rich. He was a Jesuit priest who served during a time of intense anticlericalism, and therefore carried out much of his ministry in private settings, working on behalf of the poor and homeless. Miguel and his two brothers were arrested, falsely accused of throwing a bomb at a government official's car and executed by firing squad. Just before the guns fired, he yelled, "¡Viva Cristo Rey!" meaning "Long live Christ the King!"

November 24 Justus Falckner, d.1723 Jehu Jones, d.1852; William Passavant, d.1894 pastors in North America

Not only was Falckner the first Lutheran ordained in North America, but he also published a catechism which was the first Lutheran book published on the continent. Jones was the Lutheran church's first African American pastor and carried out missionary work in Philadelphia which led to the formation there of the first African American Lutheran congregation (St. Paul's). William Passavant created and nurtured a new level of organized social ministry in western Pennsylvania, now known as Lutheran Services in America. Passavant and his legacy sought to serve the poorest of the poor, providing shelter, medical, and living assistance.

November 25 Isaac Watts, hymnwriter, d.1748 Thought by many to be the greatest hymnwriter in the English language, Isaac Watts was born in England to a family of nonconformists. He wrote about six hundred hymns, many in a two-year period beginning when he was twenty years old. Some of Watts's hymns are based on psalms, a nonconformist tradition. Ten of Watts's hymn texts are in Evangelical Lutheran Worship, including "O God, Our Help in Ages Past."

November 30 Andrew, Apostle

The first of the disciples to be called by Jesus, Andrew quickly began to bring others to the Savior, including Simon Peter. The Bible also shows him leading some Greeks to meet Jesus, and he brought forward the boy with five loaves and two fish, with which Jesus fed thousands.
